Notes on Version 3

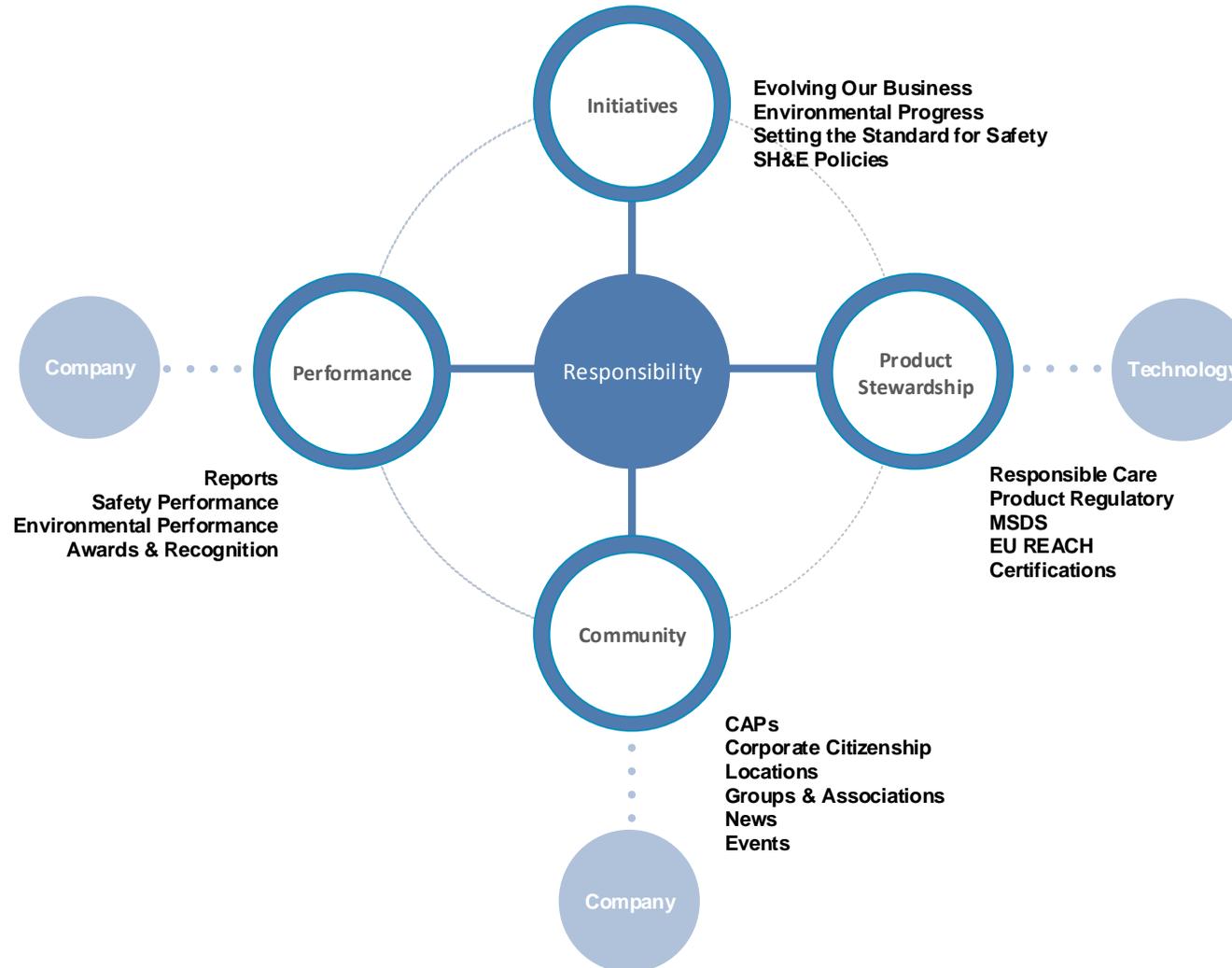
Content templates are presented next to annotated layouts for reference.

This content model has been revised to include topics from the 2012-2013 Sustainability report and November 18 Workshop.

The Responsibility section combines information about initiatives with extensive reporting and documentation resources. The section serves a “reporting out” function to customers, regulatory agencies, shareholders, employees, and trade associations.

The Community aspect focuses on sustainability at the regional and local levels, with content geared to local audiences that addresses questions and concerns about the impact of Cabot facilities on their communities.

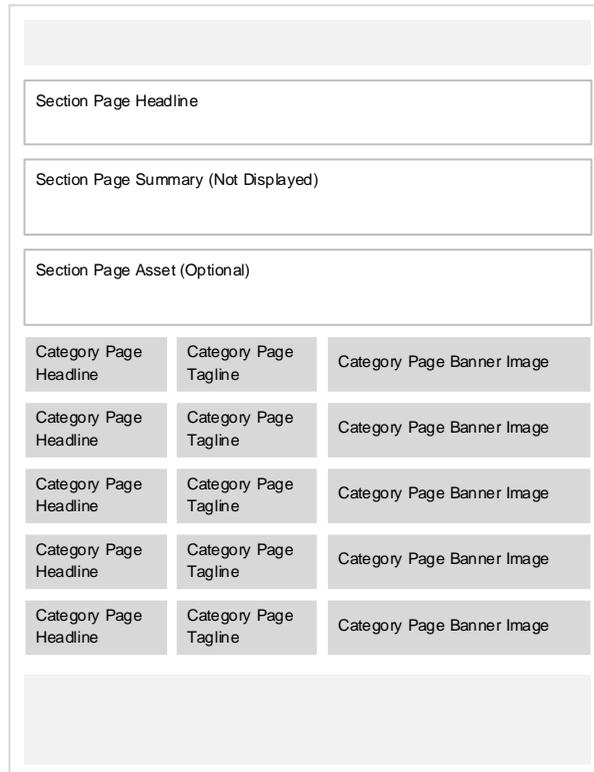
Section Summary does not display at this level, but needs to be a required element to meet accessibility guidelines.

In the Page Editor, can user edit elements that are part of a sublevel page template? For example, can the user edit a Category Tagline at this level?

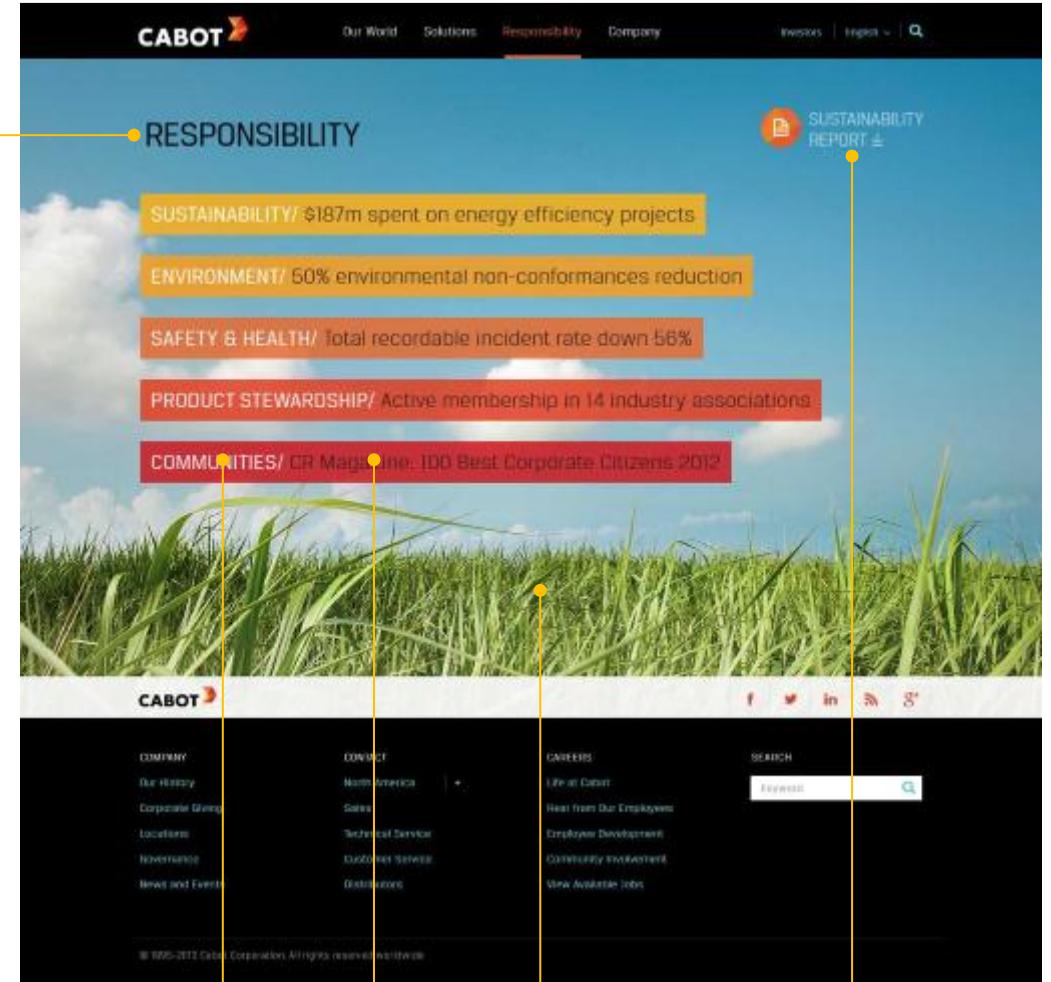

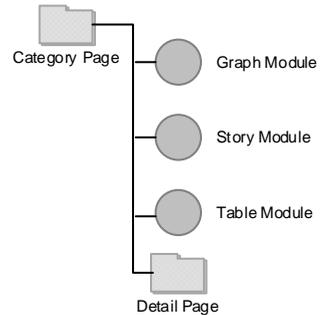
A module has Title and Copy fields. They are optional but give the author the ability to add an over-arching title and copy. If the fields are not used, they do not display.

The Module Format field is a drop-down menu that allows the author to choose a presentation format: carousel, stacked, etc.

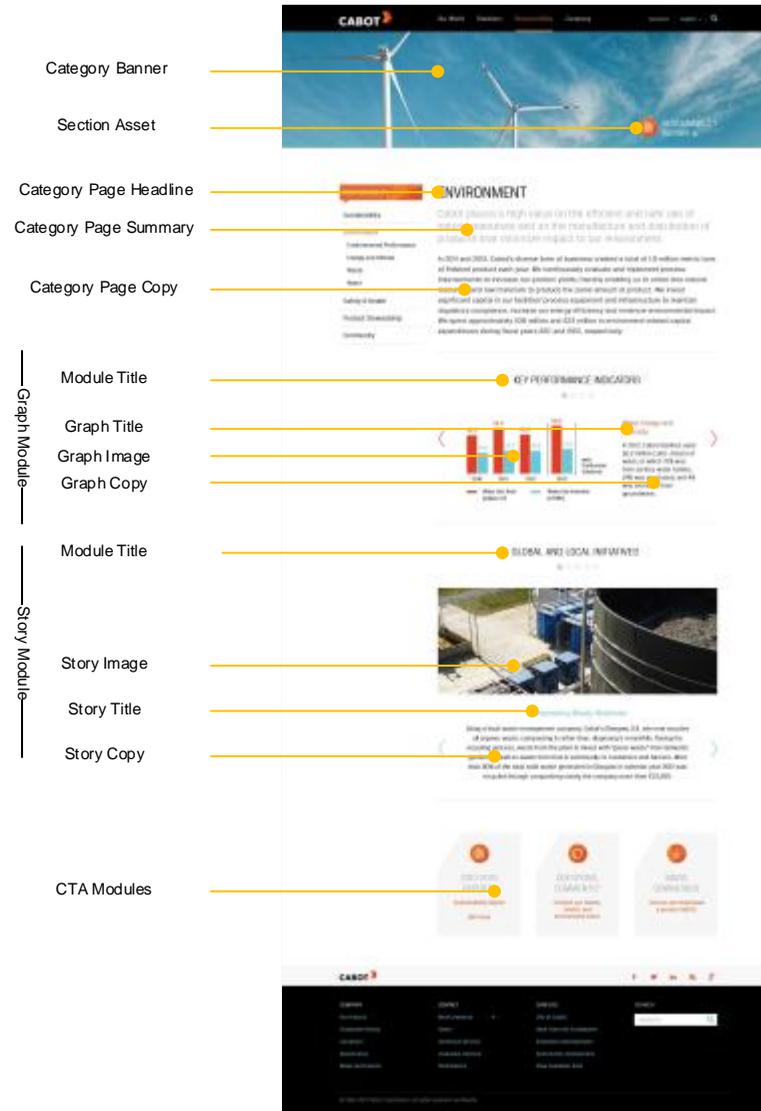
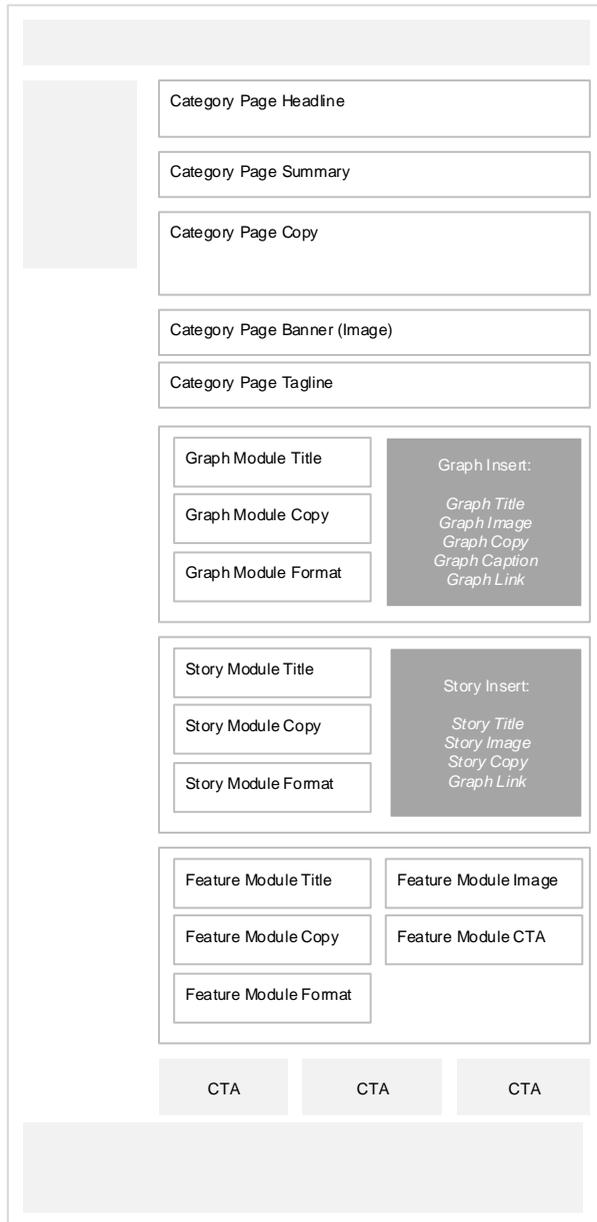
Questions:

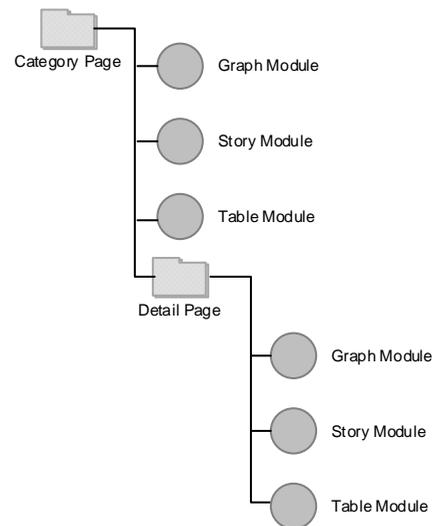
A module has Title and Copy fields. They are optional but give the author the ability to add an over-arching title and copy. If the fields are not used, they do not display.
